WIRELESS NEWS BULLETIN.

In consequence of threatening attitude of large numbers of youthful unemployed mounted and foot police have had to clear portions of the East India Road repeatedly during the evening of the 4th. Eight persons were arrested, and few were treated for minor injuries at Poplar Hospital on the 4th.

About 8,000 of the original force of Special Constables reported for duty.

There have been reports of disturbances at Woolwich and Camberwell. As regards the former they are without foundation. At Camberwells Green there was a slight disturbance last night, and four policemen received minor injuries.

Notice of the Government has been drawn to disquieting rumours circulated by disaffected persons. The Public are warned to disregard any reports than those officially issued.

V.S.C. Many new offices have been opened in different parts of the country, and the real difficulty is that supply greatly exceeds demand.

THE BRITISH GAZETTE. Reports show that arrangements for transporting and distributing worked out in a very satisfactory manner.

MINERS EXECUTIVE. It is understood that the Miners Executive is to visit the Houses of Parliament this afternoon. A Meeting will probably take place with the Leaders of the Parliamentary Labour Party.

MEETING OF THE MINERS EXECUTIVE. The International Executive of the Miners Federation was in session the whole of the forenoon at the London Office of the Federation. At the adjournment it was stated that there was no change in the situation.

TWO MONTHS FOR MR SAKATLAVA the Communist M.P. for North Battersea was sentenced at Bow Street Police Court this afternoon for two months imprisonment on failing to find sureties for his good behaviour.

L.G.O.C. 50 more buses have been put into service this afternoon, and will run on circular route No. 2.

UNDERGROUND RAILWAY. All lines in London will be opened to-day. The remaining stations on Central London Railway were opened at 3.
