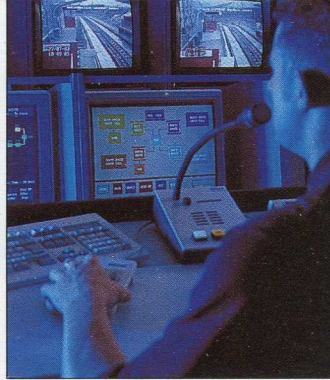

To help you and your family 'Stay Safe... Not Sorry' DLR have implemented a number of security measures.

- Closed Circuit Television monitors stations and tracks 24 hours a day, for the safety of all passengers and the detection of trespassers.
- Perimeter fencing has been erected around all DLR property and land, to keep trespassers out.
- The DLR network is patrolled by security personnel 24 hours a day.

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# Danger

## 'Stay Safe... Not Sorry'

Trespassing is an offence; walking on the tracks is trespassing and can be fatal. Although Docklands Light Railway (DLR) does everything to make the tracks as secure from trespassers as possible, some young people do find their way on to the tracks – to play or to vandalise.



It is important that parents and young people alike understand the dangers of the railway. Please make sure that all the members of your family read and understand this leaflet.

## Points to Remember

- Railway tracks are electrified. Touching the rails can cause severe burns or death.
- Tracks are in constant use 24 hours a day. This means that the tracks are electrified and trains are moving day and night.
- Trains travel quickly and quietly and can easily take trespassers by surprise.
- Objects should never be left on the tracks because they could cause an accident and injure or kill innocent people.
- It is very dangerous to throw anything at a train, it could break a window or cause an accident and injure or kill passengers.
- Tracks are monitored 24 hours a day by Closed Circuit Television. If trespassers are seen on the railway the police will be called immediately.

## On the platform

- It is dangerous to play on the platform because it is easy to fall on electrified tracks or fall in front of a train.
- Standing too close to the platform edge is dangerous because it is easy to lose your balance or be pushed onto the rails.
