

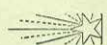

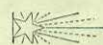

GREAT WILD STREET BOARD SCHOOLS.

PRIZE DISTRIBUTION BY LADY CONSTANCE COMBE.

Although the Hon. Lyulph Stanley, Vice-Chairman of the London School Board, was unable to be present at the first part of the entertainment, and prize distribution to the Great Wild-street Board Schools, in the Mission Chapel, on Tuesday evening last, and his place was temporarily taken by the Rev. J. L. Evans, the hon. gentleman came at a later stage, and said that although the neighbourhood was being surely depopulated, the Great Wild-street Schools had increased in average attendance, and was practically full, and that while the neighbourhood surrounding the Schools was not as favourable as in many suburban parts of London, the work done was equal to that in any of the best schools under the Board. After this high and deserved commendation Mr. Stanley expressed his gratification at the care and time the teachers had devoted out of their leisure hours on behalf of the social welfare of the scholars. The distribution of prizes was made by Lady Constance Combe, to whom a deserved vote of thanks was accorded, and for which Mr. Combe in a few happy phrases expressed acknowledgments. The chapel was, as last year, crowded in every available part, and the merit shown by the tiny performers of musical drill, the kindergarten game, and the infant songs of "The Flowers," revealed talent and good training, remarks that also fully apply to all the performers in the cantata, "The Magic Cup." Once more the Great Wild-street School entertainment was in every way a pronounced success.
