#### ARGUMENT.

Flora has been chosen Queen of the May, and the revels are about to commence. Flora meets Elsie, another captive maiden; and the Pedlar appears and informs them that measures are being taken for their rescue. The Prince and Pedlar next meet the Robber Chief to negotiate Flora's ransom. The Robber, seeing that the Prince is unarmed, takes him prisoner. The Prince now resorts to strategy, and requests a parting interview with Flora, which is granted by the Robber. The Prince finds Elsie, and recognises in her his long-lost love. She does not recognise him, and he finds out that she still remains true to him. The Prince now persuades the Robber to exchange dresses. This done, he overpowers him, and has him bound by the latter's men, who do not now recognise their master in the Prince's gar by events.
