ALARMIST RUMOURS.

The Government points out that the circulation of alarmist rumours, such as Savings Banks ceasing payment, etc. is a criminal offence.

The Bureau announces that the improved services have been well maintained during the day on the Southern Railway, and Waterloo station in particular has resumed a considerable amount of its normal busy appearance.

No congestion at Southampton. All ships cleared by voluntary labour.

Day services are being continued on the Cross Channel route, and the Waterloo and City railway is available for city workers during morning and evening rush hours.

The Government makes the following announcement:-

All ranks of armed forces of the Crown, are hereby informed that any action which they may find it necessary to take in an honest endeavour to aid the Civil Powers will receive both now and afterwards the full support of H.M. Government.

Home Office announce. Reports show that the situation remains unchanged and the country is quiet generally. In London concerted action by strikers to prevent the transport of food by road continues, but the situation is being dealt with. In the provinces attempts are also being made to cut off the supplies of electricity for essential services by calling out men from Power stations. Strikers are however being replaced.
