The Peace Problem

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York and the Leaders of the Anglican churches wish to state that they are in closest communication with each other and are actually considering ways by which Christian opinion may be brought to bear upon the present crisis, in an endeavour to find a solution.

Employees of the Newcastle Electric Supply Co. came out on strike last night when their shift ended, but there was no interruption of the supply of power.

Disturbances in Glasgow

In the East end of Glasgow disturbances occurred yesterday, resulting in several arrests. The trouble arose through a party of miners marching towards a tram depot, where they imagined that a number of students and volunteers had been housed.

Situation at Edinburgh

Some further disturbances occurred at Edinburgh last evening arising out of the throwing of stones at Corporation buses. The police dispersed the demonstrators and 9 arrests were made.

Scenes at Middlesboro'

There was a disturbance at Middlesboro' last night where an attempt was made to hold up a passenger train, but the crowd dispersed after being harrangued by members of the Town Council. The demonstration was made outside the branch offices of the local newspaper. Order however, was soon restored.

The Colonial Wool Merchants Association announce that they have decided to postpone indefinitely the public sale of wool and sheepskins until such time as sales can be held by public auction.

We are instructed by the Chief Civil Commissioner to make the following amouncement: Two men have been arrested at Marlebone to-day for selling leaflets declaring that the CivilRolice had come out on strike. There was no truth whatever in the allegation and the two men will appear to-morrow morning at Marlebone Police Court.

Over 1,000 trained men are available at the volunteer training centre at Chiswick, and another special circular route will be established to-day. Other services will be introduced as quickly as possible as men can be passed through the training process. All routes will be run from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. unless otherwise stated.

One of the brightest announcements we have to make is the steady maintenance of the milk supply. Last night 2900 churns of milk were received at Paddington.

Owing to the pressure of the telephone service at the Railway Information Bureau, intending passengers are asked to refrain from telephoning up inquiring for news respecting the train services, but to call at local stations.

The Batavier Line. The Batavier Line states a Rotterdam message, announce sailings for London to-day and Saturday evening.

The Home Office report that in kha London and the Home Counties, no serious trouble occurred yesterday. The L.G.O.C.'s service of buses were working smoothly. There was interference with the transport of Petrol at Fulham and Chiswick. Members of the Cavalry, and volunteers were enrolled as extra mounted police.

In spite of attempts at Newport, the power station men were reported as remaining at work.

The White Star Liner "Cedric" was coaling successfuly, and one steamer was unloading wheat by volunteers.
