APPEAL BY THE GOVERNMENT FOR FURTHER CONSTABULARY RESERVES FCR LONDON.

There are at present two forces attached to the police in London.

The Metropolitan Special Constabulary Reserves and The Metropolitan Special Emergency Sonstabulary.

Swing however to the tactics employed by ill-disposed persons taking advantage of the present crisis, it has been necessary to expand and organise a further force of loyal citizens willing to give their whole time towards helping the Metropolitan Police. This new force will be designated the Civil Constabulary, and will be paid as a whole time force.

The following are eligible to join:-(A) Officers and other ranks of the Territorial Army and the Officers' Training Corps,

(B) Ex Military men who can be vouched for at Territorial Army Head Quarters. Age limit 50 yrs. Men engaged on vital public service should remain in their present employment.

Pay at the foll-wing rates: - Commander 10/-Inspector 7/6 Sergeant 6/-Constable 5, -

An allowance of 5/- per wk given to each man to cover clothing, washing and incidentals. Army rations free and also accommodation. Until such time as food can be issued 2/6 per day will be given to each man.

Employers are carnestly requested to encourage and give every sympathy to employees to enroll themselves.

Established to-day, Monday, May 10th at 7 a.m. in all Drill Halls in City of London and County of Landon Association. Recruits should bring Health and unemployment books and cards.

GENERAL NEWS.

Two meetings in London yesterday conducted in an orderly manner.

On Saturday the Organising Secretary of the Shoreditch Labour Party was charged with having seditious literature in his possession.

Police prevented a Communist Meeting being held near Edgeware Rd., and made two arrests.

Disturbance took place in Battersea last night. Several Policemen and Specials injured. Two men arrested for sedition.

MOSCOW CHEQUE RETURNED.

The General Council of the T.U.C. have issued the following statement:-

This morning a cheque arrived from the All Russian Central Council of Trade Unions in Moscow. This ran into some thousands of pounds. The Council fully considered the matter, and decided to send a courteous reply, expressing their appreciation, but their inability to accept the cheque, which has been returned.

MR. THOMAS ON THE SITUATION.
