The effect of the situation since yesterday has undergone little change in London and the Home Counties. In the South Midland division it has improved satisfactorily.

TRANSPORT GENERALLY: Railway services throughout the country are satisfactory: The emergency road transport arrangements continue to work smoothly, the ordinary rate of transport is steadily improving.

DOCKS: In the London Docks the discharge of 15 steemers was in progress yesterday and the loading and unloading of steamers in Southampton commenced yesterday. Loading was continued quite satisfactorily today.

GENERAL: Yesterday was quite quiet in all areas. There was some rowdyism but there was no record of any grave disturbances.

EMERGENCY FOOD SERVICE: All emergency food services, in common with other emergency services are being continued for the present. For the present also convoys of food stuffs will continue, also the Hyde Park milk supplies.

It having been stated that Railway Companies are refusing to take members back, except on a wage reduction, the Railway Companies wish to state that this is absolutely incorrect.

UNDER CROUND RAILWAY: The Underground services provided yesterday are being maintained today, and the following additional facilities are being introduced. CHARING CROSS Station is now open also South Kensington on the Piccadilly line. The L G O C. services provided yesterday are also running today. The same remark also applies to the Metropolitan Electric services.

LIVERPOOL DECISION: The men in all the electric trades in Liverpool have decided to remain out on strike unless the employers agree to take them back in a body.

TRANSPORT WORKERS UNION: The Transport & General Workers Union announcement that it has now been decided to respond to the Prime Ministers' appeal, all the Union Officers and Secretaries are making an appeal to employees to rusume work.

SURPIRSE FOR RETURNED WORKERS: The men of the Stratford Works of the L & N E Rly presented themselves for work this morning, and were met with the following notice:-

"Arrangements are being made to re-open the works
"as soon as possible for men whose services are
"required. Such men will be notified by post
"as and when required".

Volunteers are to continue work at Keedk docks pending arrangements of the dockers to return. Mass meetings of Railwaymen at Sheffield decided to stay out until the Companies re-instate all men on the same conditions prevailing before the strike.

FIGHT ING IN WARSAW: News has reached Berlin that heaves fitting fighting occurred yesterday in Warsaw, following an attempt to overthrow the Government. Many persons are stated to have been killed and wounded. The Government is reported as having resigned, and the President of the Republic is expected to follow suit.
