AN APPENCIATION OF CHE PORTION: While there were no further disturb noce that is as yet no general resumption of work. This is not surprising in view of the necessity for new negotiations between employers and employed, but it is believed that the rate of progress today will be satisfactorily accelerated. Various factors are contributing to this, end. Chief of these is the excellent effect created by the debate held in the House of Commons last night. The Frime Minister was succeeded by Mr. Thomas who stated that, consequent upon the withdrawal of the strike many employers were creating difficulties to a general resumption of work by deliberately outling down wages. In this connection, the Frime Minister said "I will not countenance any attempt on the part of employers to use this occasion to try in any way to get a reduction of wages below those in force before the strike began, or to get an increase in house. Mr. Thomas said that he did not know who was associable for the statement that the Hailways intended to reduce wages.

ACREEM IN BETWEEN UND IS CHOOK L.C. O.C. AND CHIEF ALLIE SERVICES:

It is amounced that an agreement has been reached between employers and employed, and those services will be running tomorrow under normal conditions. This amouncement has already contributed to the creation of a better atmosphere generally.

L C.C. trams were not running, and in those districts usually served by trans, thousands of people were disappointed in their hope of riding to work. A great many taxis were on the road and of course.
